- 4. Standing Committees: Discussion
 - a. **Membership** An-Min mentioned that the membership spreadsheet needs to be updated/fixed. Christine and An-Min will work on the spreadsheet, which is needed for the upcoming CGIA board nomination emails.
 - b. **Website** Mark & Steve Steve reported that the Website is up to date. The map of CA GIS contacts has been updated; however, Steve will check on how contacts get updated behind the scenes
 - c. Awards Fiona & Erin
 - Gearing up the nominations
 - Fiona needs to know what the award for the student project/paper will be named, and Christine noted that we can copy the name of the award from last year. Student submissions can come from high school or college and university.
 - The awards should be extended to include projects completed in Fall 2017 as well.
 - O. New category: Best Story Map create new description. There should be some language about a Story Maps built on any platform. Insert some guidelines on how the "best" will be judged
 - Christine will follow up with Fiona to finalize the announcements.
 - GIS-Pro & CalGIS 2018 Awards will be given during breakfast on Thurs, Oct 11th at 8:00 AM. Whoever is chair or someone on the board can present the awards; at this time, Christine, Steve and Jen will be attending. There will be daycare at the event.
 - d. Elections Dave Powers & Melisa



- Nominations will start on May 21
- Dave created a nomination form and this will be sent out soon. He added a place where applicants can volunteer to be vice chair or chair, and a place where you can check what category / sector you'd like to participate in, within the board.
- Christine nominated Mary Hurley to be treasurer again. Jennifer seconded Mary's nomination. There was a unanimous vote to elect Mary to be the CGIA Board Treasurer 2018-2019.
- Christine posed a question to the board about restructuring the board sectors based on geography to have a better distribution of members. Dave P. stated that the current board sectors and membership covers a lot of different sectors and that the present board (16) is good coverage. Mary and Steve S. suggested that we add / move the utilities slots to other sectors. Christine suggested that the Utilities sector be removed, since only one person has filled this slot in the last 4 years. Sonja has represented Utilities in the past and also concurred with these changes to the board sectors positions.
- Christine made a motion to about restructuring the board categories / sectors, which was followed by a discussion about the following proposed updates to positions, and how to rename the Regional Council of Governments and Regional Association of Governments Sector:
 - i. Remove the Utilities sector from the board.
 - ii. Move 1 Utilities position to "Regional Council of Governments and Regional Association of Governments"
 - iii. Move 1 Utilities position to "Private Sector Companies"
 - iv. Rename "Regional Council of Governments and Regional Association of Governments"...to "Regional Government and Districts"
- Steve seconded the motion noted above. There was a unanimous vote to approve the restructuring the board categories / sectors as noted above.
- Dave Powers noted that the nomination ballots will be going out next week. There will be an opportunity to nominate people for the Vice Chair and Chair positions.
- Dave Powers and Dave Peck are considering applying for the positions of Vice Chair and Chair for 2018-2019. Tia will run for Vice-Chair if Dave Powers says yes, hah!
- Christine motioned to move Steve Steinberg from the position under "Regional Council of Governments and Regional Association of Governments Sector" to "County Government". Jennifer seconded the motion. There was a unanimous vote approval for Steve to move from Regional Council... to County Government.



- Jennifer suggested that An-Min consider applying to be secretary next year, and Jennifer applying to move back to an education slot.
 All agreed that we should wait for the official board nomination ballots to process any other changes in board positions.
