- 4. Treasurer's Report (Mary Hurley)
 - Treasurer's Report for July 1, 2022 June 30, 2023
 - Annual Treasurer's Report June 2023 July 1 2024
 - CGIA should consider an alternate treasurer What does it entail: end of year, coordinating with tax preparer, make sure memberships are all accounted for, where does all our income come from; every 5 years need to file with attorney general.
 - Balance: \$39,430
 - By using Stripe/PayPal recurring payments are on by default. Can turn this off in settings or notify treasurer. Occasionally, payments are duplicated or if a member is no longer interested and requests a refund. This is relevant because every time we issue a refund, CGIA is charged a fee.
- 5. Chair's Goals (+ Vice-Chair, Email)
 - Support committees' goals; train an alternate treasurer; budget planning; 3-5 year strategic plan; quarterly update to general membership including committee activities and 2 general meetings in Fall (November) and Spring (April)
 - Jane suggested having the general meetings during lunch or late afternoon

 - From Jane SK Idea to drive membership, borrowed from something that NorCal URISA used to do. Hold a training workshop (half-day or all-day, on a topic of broad interest) that would have a fee equivalent to or higher than our annual membership fee for non-members, but free for members. Allow the non-members to automatically become members upon payment of the fee. Hold this near the beginning of the membership year.

V. OTHER BUSINESS // SPECIAL PROJECTS

- <u>CalGIS 2024</u>
 - o March 18-20, 2024 in Visalia, CA
 - Having CGIA awards at CalGIS will not be a possibility next year
 - CGIA Awards will be at @ UC 2024 and can highlight 30 years of CGIA. Awards committee can come up with alternative venues to present awards if not at ESRI UC.
 - Due to URISA restructuring, they will no longer need CGIA as a co-sponsor.
 - No more discounts for CGIA members since we are no longer a co-funder of event
 - Javier pointed out that since CGIA is no longer funding CalGIS we can focus on regional meetups and user groups – will probably involve Engagement committee
 - In past years, depending on location of the CalGIS conference, CGIA has received up to \$2,000 - \$4,000 in revenue.
 - CGIA can look at increasing sustaining memberships
- UC GIS Fiscal Partnership (Mary & Jacob collecting information)
 - More information at next meeting. Use non-profit organization (CGIA) to pass through monies and we would get 10% overhead.
