II. MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL - March 2024

• Guphy made a motion to approve minutes. Tia seconded. All approved.

III. INTERNAL BUSINESS

- 1. Treasurer's Report (Mary Hurley)
 - Treasurer's Report April 2024
 - CPA finished 2023 taxes. Mary sent a check for tax prep
 - Check for expenses for electrical and internet at CalGIS to Jacob
 - \$40,039 balance

2. Chair Updates:

- Jacob would like to make a recommendation / put forth a draft for a couple of amendments to bylaws.
 - o To have an at-large/constituency and/or retiree slot
 - When we made the last change, we made a change to have 2 representatives across the board. Would like to move that back to 3 for private sector to have a greater balance and there are most likely as many private sector members as well as public sector.
 - Mary would like to remove the federal slots since federal employees are not allowed to sit on any boards. Jacob suggests to leave as-is and see if there's any interest
 - o Everyone should re-read and see if there are changes that should be made.

- C. Advocacy (Jane Schafer-Kramer) February Meeting Notes
 - Jacob went over <u>report</u> from Jane
 - o Jane mentioned that we should pay close attention to NSDI revisioning
 - GIS Under the Dome Some of the GIS-related bills have AI component
 - Jacob attended NSGIC Midyear Meeting
 - Spoke to staffer at Senator Padilla's office. Topics included USGS 3D elevation, national addressing, NG911 funding
 - Presented the CA SDI map.

- F. Engagement & Communications (Dan Scollon) February meeting notes
 - CGIA Conversation Series (Dan)
 - Will not have a fourth webinar
 - Modoc and Trinity counties face challenges with regards to GIS and available data. An example where a retiree member category would come in handy and potentially be a way for CGIA to channel some resources.
 - Sacramento users group appreciative of \$200 for coffee/pastries
 - Plan to have meetings twice a year going forward
 - Professional Development Series (Christine, Tia, Juan)
 - Topics for workshop
 - i. 48 registered for April session, which is fewer than Session 1. Need help promoting
 - ii. Locked down fee-structure for workshop
 - iii. Propose we look at top 5-6 topics from survey and speak with Laura Royal to do a workshop that combines a few of the topics or focuses on 1 of the topics.
 - iv. Although the survey showed that project management was the highest vote-getter, this would ideally be covered by a URISA workshop

- G. Community Council (Chad Miller) March Meeting Agenda
 - Putting together preliminary agenda for next community council meeting in June after which Chad's 2-year chairmanship will be up
 - Since the integration, Chad feels that there's a lot of redundancy and there is less need to be so formal (i.e. having a charter and various processes).
 - Having a separate charter for Community Council is counterproductive and should just fall under CGIA's charter.
 - Goal for the Council is to share information with the state. As a result, a charter revocation vote is planned
 - There's also overlaps between the Community Council board and CGIA board
 - Chad Miller put forth a motion to revoke Community Council charter. Jane seconded. All approved.
 - i. Next step is to get a new chair for Community Council
 - Community Council should function as a forum and not as a Council like other states have.
 - Next terms plans
 - o Current coordinating committee member is interested in being chair.
 - Chad wants to focus on integrating Community Council website and merging email lists.
